

On the first day of the competition, under the guidance of Referee Faustin Moses Rethinam and Samson Rethinam, a refereeing seminar with a theoretical and practical part, a technical seminar, as well as a qualification exam for judges were held.











There were more than 50 judges at this seminar, all participants of the seminar were in the WKC judicial uniform, perfectly prepared according to the rules of the WKC. Everyone actively participated, debated, asked questions and received answers, thereby increasing their theoretical and practical knowledge.

On the next day of the competition, the All-India National Karate and Kobudo Tournament was held at the Monfort Indoor Stadium, Santhome High School. More than 1000 athletes participated in this tournament. All styles are developing in India, especially the styles that prevail: shorin-ryu, goju-ryu, shito-ryu, shotokan and kobudo. It was interesting to watch the performance of the athletes, each of them showed maximum efficiency and a good level of training.

After the national competition, the Indo-Russia Karate WKC Goodwill Tournament began. The best athletes of India (champions of the national tournament) participated in this tournament against athletes from Russia.

All participants were well prepared, demonstrated a high level of skill and professionalism. Two gold medals were won by Mikhail Terentev (Samara region) in the age category of 6-7 years in the discipline kata (all styles) and in kumite sanbon - 25 kg. His brother Andrei Terentev managed to win in the age category of 10-11 years and in the discipline kata (all styles). Liudmila Grigoreva, an athlete from the Chuvash Republic, won two medals among women aged 18 and older, 1st place in kata (shotokan style), 3rd place in kata (all styles).










Thomas arrived in Kerala from Israel in 52 and preached until the age of 72, when he was martyred on the mountain, later called Mount St. Thomas.
